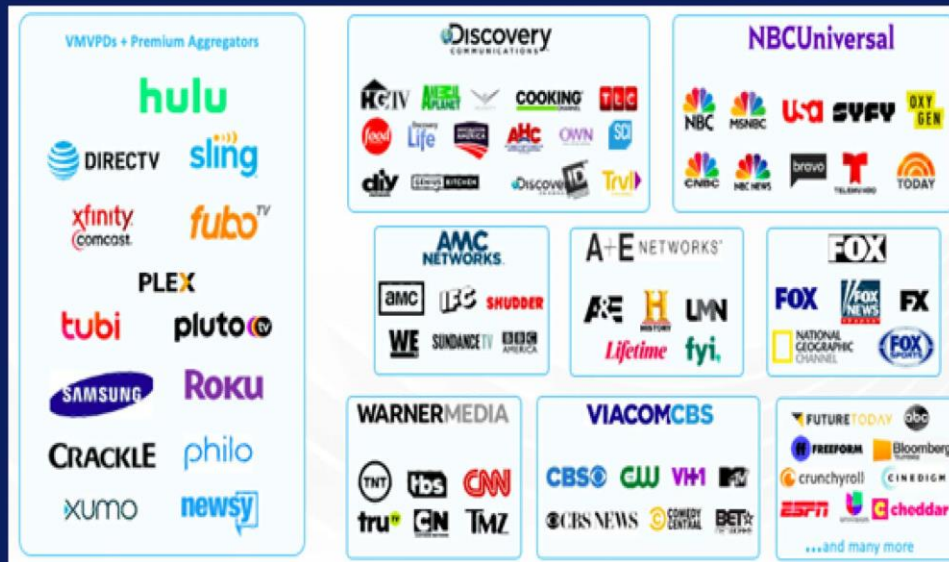

What is NATURAL GAS?





It all started millions of years ago! As plants and animals died, their remains built up over time on the Earth's surface and on ocean floors. As more time passed, these remains were buried under layers of silt, sand and rock. Heat and pressure changed the decayed matter into oil, coal and natural gas.

Did you know? ★★★★★


Natural gas is actually invisible and has no smell. Your natural gas company adds a lead odor to the natural gas to help you smell if there is a gas leak. The odor that is added to natural gas is stinky like rotten eggs. If you ever smell something like this, tell an adult as soon as possible because there may be a gas leak and they should contact the gas company to come fix it.

Rotten Eggs → 

Natural gas is pulled from deep underground and used as an energy source. Natural gas is used all around us. We use it in our homes to cook, heat water for warm showers, and dry clothes. We use it outside to light dark nights, grill, and gather around a firepit.

cooking →  **hot water** → 

It's also used by businesses to make many things including paper, glass, bricks, steel and iron. Even hospitals depend on natural gas to keep hospitals running if the power goes out. And it's used to make electricity.

811 Know what's BELOW

Since pipelines run underground, have your parents call 811 before digging in your yard. Workers will mark underground utility lines so you don't damage them or hurt yourself when digging.

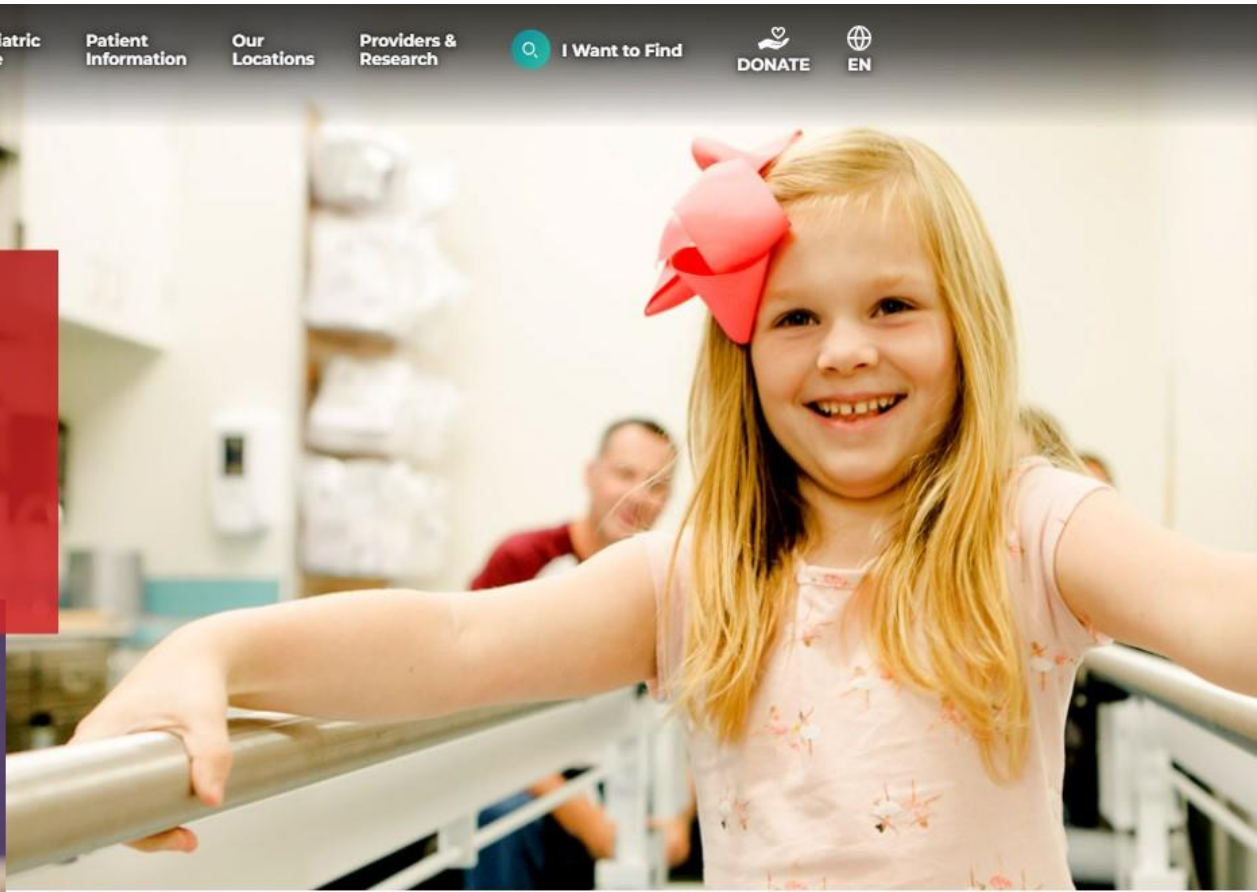
