MINUTES OF A MEETING

OF THE

ALABAMA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION HELD TUESDAY, January 7, 2025

The January 2025 meeting of the Alabama Public Service Commission was held on Tuesday, January 7, 2025, in the Carl L. Evans Chief Administrative Law Judge Hearing Room Complex, 100 North Union Street, Montgomery, Alabama. Commission President Twinkle Andress Cavanaugh called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. with Commissioner Jeremy H. Oden and Commissioner Chris V. Beeker, III, present. The following staff members were also present: John A. 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Commissioner Cavanaugh noted that the public was informed of today's Commission meeting by notice dated November 25, 2024.

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Commission Cavanaugh introduced Commissioner Oden who opened the meeting with prayer and led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

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Commissioner Cavanaugh then opened the floor for a motion to approve the minutes of the December 3, 2024, Commission Meeting.

Upon being motioned by Commissioner Oden and seconded by Commissioner Cavanaugh, the Commissioners voted unanimously to approve the minutes.

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UTILITY SERVICES DIVISION

Mr. Johnston reported for the Utility Services Division on Consumer Service Complaint Inquiries for the period of December 2024 as follows: Alabama Power Company had sixteen residential inquiries, Spire Alabama had one residential inquiry, and Spire Gulf had zero residential inquire. There was a total of seven telecommunication inquiries, consisting of zero under Public Service Commission jurisdiction, five were referred back to the companies since the company's waived jurisdiction and two were not under PSC jurisdiction.

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Mr. Johnston reported on Rate RSE for Spire Alabama Inc., based on preliminary figures as November 30, 2024, the projected RSE return on average common equity for the rate year ending September 30, 2025, was 9.90 percent. The authorized return on average common equity is 9.50 to 9.90 percent.

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Mr. Johnston reported on Rate RSE for Spire Gulf Inc., based on preliminary figures as of November 30, 2024, the projected RSE return on average common equity for the rate year ending September 30, 2025, was 10.20 percent. The authorized return on average common equity is 9.70 percent to 10.30 percent.

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Mr. Johnson reported on the following dockets from the Utility Service Agenda:

Informal Docket U-5477, Spire Alabama, Inc., Application for approval of Base Contract for Sale and Purchase of Natural Gas with Gunvor USA LLC and recommended granting approval of application.

Upon motion by Commissioner Cavanaugh and seconded by Commissioner Oden, the Commissioners voted unanimously to accept the recommendation.

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Formal Docket 29120, Plantation Water System, Application Petition to increase residential water rates for Plantation Water System and recommended granting approval of application.

Upon motion by Commissioner Cavanaugh and seconded by Commissioner Oden, the Commissioners voted unanimously to accept the recommendation.

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Informal Docket U-5476, Bellsouth Telecommunications, LLC D/B/A AT&T Alabama or AT&T Southeast and BIF Intrepid OPCO LLC, Application for approval of an Interconnection Agreement between BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Alabama or AT&T Southeast and BIF IV Intrepid OpCo LLC pursuant to Sections 251 and 252 of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 and recommended granting approval of application.

Upon motion by Commissioner Cavanaugh and seconded by Commissioner Oden, the Commissioners voted unanimously to accept the recommendation.

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Mr. Johnston noted that the remaining item on the Telecommunications Agenda under "Summary of Other Filings" are for informational purpose only.

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GAS PIPELINE SAFETY DIVISION

Mr. Kimbril reported for the Gas Pipeline Safety (GPS) Division Agenda on the following inspections during the month of November.

The National Response Center (NRC) reported eight incidents in November:

As of November 30th, 3,581 Alabama carriers (42%) registered for 2025 UCR with 4,993 remaining unregistered. Our office received funds from the UCR Depository for October online payments processed through the National Registration System (NRS) that came from 3,042 carriers domiciled in Alabama and in non-participating states.

MCS staff attended a UCR call to give feedback regarding the Standards & Best Practices Course Review which is part of the UCR Learning Management System the UCR Board is creating.

The staff also assisted motor carriers in making necessary changes to their operating status with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). There were four MCS-150 forms processed. One Motor Carrier had its USDOT number deactivated. Three MCS-150 forms containing updates to the motor carriers' USDOT number data.

There were four For Non-Profit (FNP) quarterly reports received from FNP carriers for the third quarter, one for the second quarter, and one for the first quarter of 2024.

In November, passenger tariffs for Johnny On The Spot Car Service LLC (C4168) and Inspirational NEMT Services, LLC (C4160) Additionally, one passenger were received and accepted. supplement for Angel Wing's Transport, L.L.C. (C4163) was accepted.

Staff participated in two passenger carrier hearings that were held during November for:

- •DBT of Alabama LLC
- •Wheelcare, L.L.C

One desk audit was completed on the following household goods carriers:

•Applewhite Movers LLC (C4119) - Several issues were found, and the carrier was advised to follow its current staff tariff or submit a new tariff/ supplement.

ELECTRICITY POLICY DIVISION

Mrs. Smith reported for the Electricity Policy Division on Rate RSE for Alabama Power Company stating that the Weighted Return on Average Retail Common Equity Forecast as of December 31, 2024, is 6.43 percent. Mrs. Smith also reported for the month of November 2024 energy cost applicable to Rate ECR was over-recovered by \$20,800,683. The authorized Weighted Retail Return on Average Common Equity Range is 5.75-6.15 percent.

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Mrs. Champion reported on Informal Docket U-5024, On December 20, 2024, Alabama Power Company (the "Company") filed a petition seeking to modify Rate BTAL (Business Time Advantage - Large). The Company proposes to include language that acknowledges its right to negotiate terms and conditions in the contract for electric service that customers taking service under the rate typically execute if the service request reflects a load obligation in excess of 30,000 kVA. The Company's filing letter explains that comparable language exists in other rate schedules used for large load customers. The Company also notes that consistent with the requirements of the Code of Alabama, such negotiated terms and conditions would be subject to Commission approval, and recommended granting approval of petition.

Upon motion by Commissioner Oden and seconded by Commissioner Cavanaugh, the Commissioners voted unanimously to accept these recommendations.

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LEGAL DIVISION

Judge Bentley reported on the following dockets from the Legal Division Agenda:

Formal Dockets 32451, Petition of New Line Transport, LLC d/b/a Tri State Carriers, of Miami, Florida, for cancellation, and recommend granting cancellation,

Informal Formal Docket C-21111, Petition of G4 Hauling and Excavation, LLC, of Valley head, Alabama, for approval of cargo self-insurance, and recommended granting approval of application,

Formal Docket 33048, Petition of Dutton Investments, LLC d/b/a College Hunks Hauling Junk & Moving, of Daphne, Alabama, for cancellation of Motor Carrier Certificate 4114, and recommend granting cancellation,

Informal Docket C-21072 and Formal Docket 33222, Petition of Danny E Beck d/b/a D&H Trucking of Letohatchee, Alabama, for cancellation of Motor Carrier Certificate F5319 (Docket 33222). Motor Carrier Certificate F5319 was revoked by Commission Order dated November 5, 2024, due to Petitioner's failure to maintain proper proof of liability and cargo insurance coverage (Informal Docket C-21072); and recommended vacate November 5, 2024, order of Revocation and reinstatement of motor carrier certificate F5319, and

Informal Docket C-21069, Petition of Jeff's Mobile Home Transporters, Inc., of Wilmer, Alabama, for reinstatement of Motor Carrier Certificate F3024 which was revoked due to Petitioner's failure to maintain proper proof of cargo insurance coverage; and recommended Revocation and reinstatement of motor carrier certificate F3024.

Upon motion by Commissioner Cavanaugh and seconded by Commissioner Oden, the Commissioners voted unanimously to accept these recommendations.

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Judge Garner reported from Legal Division Agenda on the following Dockets:

Formal Docket 27256, Petition of Farmer's Telecommunications Corporation ("FTC") for designation as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier ("ETC") solely for the purpose of offering Lifeline Service in Alabama, and recommended granting approval of application.

Upon motion by Commissioner Oden and seconded by Commissioner Cavanaugh, the Commissioners voted unanimously to accept these recommendations.

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Judge Garner recommended approval of the administrative items.

Upon motion by Commissioner Cavanaugh and seconded by Commissioner Beeker, the Commissioners voted unanimously to

accept the recommendation.

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Commissioner Cavanaugh concluded with stating that the next Commission meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, February 4, 2025.

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There being no further business, Commissioner Cavanaugh adjourned the meeting at 10:32 a.m.
